Faith Bible History

Faith Bible Christian School opened a campus in Aloha in 1976 with a student population of 100 students. The purpose of the school was to provide sound academic training while helping students to develop Christian character. From the beginning the Bible has been the very center of our curriculum. While we offer a complete curriculum in required and elective subjects, every attempt is made to teach each class from the perspective of a Christian world view.

In 1996 the high school opened a new campus in Hillsboro. This year Faith Bible will enroll about 240 students at our K-8 Aloha campus and about 140 students at our high school campus. Although the school has grown and changed in some ways, students still receive personal attention and professional help from caring teachers. Through the years hundreds of students have received a quality education and growth in their Christian lives.

Our Responsibilities

Students will show responsibility by:

- following school rules
- coming to school each day
- working hard to do their best in class and in school work
- helping to keep their school safe
- asking for help when they need it
- showing respect for and cooperating with other students and adults
- reporting infractions of school rules to staff

Parents will help children learn to take responsibility by:

- having high expectations for their children as individuals
- ensuring their children attend school and are on time
- finding a quiet place at home for school work and making sure work is completed
- helping their children learn and solve conflicts in positive ways
- communicating and working with teachers and other school staff to support and challenge their children
- respecting school staff

Educators will help parents and students by:

- believing that all students can achieve
- showing that they care about all students
- having challenging academic and behavioral expectations for students
- providing a positive learning environment
- creating an atmosphere of open communication for students seeking help

Before and After School Guidelines

School hours are 8:00AM – 2:45PM.

Students may arrive on campus as early as 7:00AM. Students may use room #3 in the main building for study. They may also use the gymnasium for basketball or volleyball. One staff member will supervise from 7:15 to 7:45AM. Students must be picked up from school by 4:00PM since it is possible that all staff could be gone and the building locked by that time.

Communications

Office Hours

The school office will be open and available for business or phone calls between the hours of 7:45AM and approximately 5:00PM

Flyers

Occasionally, flyers with special announcements may be sent home with the student.

Open House

In September, one evening will be scheduled for Open House. During the evening, parents will have the opportunity to follow their child's schedule. They will visit each classroom, meet the teacher, and hear about the class guidelines, content, and grading.

Parent / Teacher Fellowship

Following the end of the first, second, and third quarter, the board and administration will hold a meeting for all parents. The administration will talk about the most recent news related to each campus and the board will communicate to parents current issues and long range planning for the good of the school. This is a great time to be informed of things that will directly affect your child.

Parent / Teacher Conferences

Shortly after the first quarter ends and grades are received, two afternoons and evenings are set aside for parents to schedule conferences with their child's teachers. Sign-up lists will be posted in the office hallway with 15 minute time slots running from lunch time to about 8:00PM on these two days. Parents are encouraged to sign up for conferences a few days prior to the scheduled days. Our staff will use each of these mornings to prepare for conferences so students will have no school on these two days.

Grade Reports

In order to keep parents informed of their child's progress, we have developed 6 reports that communicate academic progress. They include 3-week, 6-week, mid-term, daily, weekly, and final grade reports. These reports are detailed in the section on grading. These reports are described in the subsection entitled "Academic Progress".

School Closures

Due to weather or emergency conditions, school may be closed for the day. You may check our website www.faithkids.org or www.flashnews.net for closures.

Telephone Use

Parents who wish to contact their child may call the school office and the message will be forwarded to the classroom. If necessary, he/she may return your call at break or lunchtime. If an emergency exists, we will send for the child immediately.

The phones at FBHS are for office and staff use only. Students may use the office phone with permission from the Secretary. No other use of phones is permitted.

Cell Phones

Students at FBHS may have cell phones. Phones must be turned off and may not be used during the school day. If phones are powered up or used during the school day, they will be confiscated and returned in one week. Parents who desire to get a message to a student must call the office and we will relay the message, or if necessary, call him/her to the phone.

Moms In Touch

A number of parents meet one day a week at the high school to pray for the students and staff. All parents are welcome to participate in this group. Give the office a call and they will give you the number of a contact person.

Dress Code

The purpose for Faith Bible High School in formulating and utilizing a dress standard is to characterize modesty, focus on appropriate and sensible appearance, emphasize inner qualities, and establish an attitude and atmosphere at school that is conducive to academic learning and spiritual growth. Students and parents must agree to uphold the following community standards. The administration and faculty will interpret the degree to which the student meets the dress code. If an infraction occurs, a detention will be assessed and the student will be restricted to the office until appropriate clothing can be obtained. All missed classes will be considered unexcused. Students who continually “push the limits” of the code will be dismissed.

All dress-codes apply during all school events including retreats and athletic events.

Some exceptions are made for Spirit Week and our Winter Formal.

General Information

- Hats may not be worn on campus during the school day unless specifically designated days for wearing them have been approved.
- Chapel day will be observed as a dress up day. Girls must wear dresses or skirts that are to the **kneecap or below**. Boys must wear dress slacks and an appropriate collared dress shirt and tie. All students must wear dress shoes on chapel day. No pull over sweatshirts allowed on chapel day.
- Students may wear modest, loose fitting, shorts but no cut-offs. Shorts must be no shorter than 5” above the knee and no longer than knee length. Shorts may not be worn on chapel day.
- All pants must be appropriately sized to the student. Sagging and baggy pants are not allowed. Pants also must be of reasonable length (test – with shoes off pants must not reach the floor when extended).
- All students must wear appropriate undergarments to school and school related functions.
- No chains, spikes or studs may be worn as part of jewelry or clothing.
- Students may not have tatoos.
- No apparel or jewelry body art shall be worn that could represent questionable parts of our culture, such as “punk”, “goth”, “grunge”, etc. Clothing should be neat, clean and modest and should not reflect a specific cause or movement. The administration will be the final judge as to the appropriateness of clothing or appearance.

Females

Hair

Hair must be clean and conservative in style, color, and cut. No unnatural hair colors are permitted.

Make-up

Make-up must be natural looking, applied conservatively and in good taste.

Shoes

Shoes must be worn at all times.

Skirts/Dresses

Skirts and dresses must be to the **kneecap or longer in length** and must not be snug in fit. Slits must be no higher than three inches above the knee. Skirts or dresses must be worn on chapel day. Shorts that resemble a skirt must meet guidelines for skirts.

Jewelry

Jewelry must be conservative in style. Pierced earrings are permitted to be worn in the ears by female students but no other body piercing ornament may be worn at school or any other school related activity (including sports events). No chains, spikes or studs may be worn as part of jewelry or clothing.

Hats

No hats may be worn on campus during the school day. Spirit week is the only exception to this rule.

Pants

Proper fitting pants may be worn on any day except chapel day, tight or **extremely baggy** pants are **not** acceptable. Pants must be worn at the **natural waistline**. Pants that are fashioned to **appear not at the natural waistline are not acceptable**. Low rise pants are not acceptable. Sweat pants or tear-a-way sweats are not acceptable. No pajama type pants may be worn in school. All pants must be modest, without frayed cuffs or holes.

Tops

Tops must be modest and loose fitting. Low cut fronts or backs, see-through fabrics and tank tops, halter tops, or the like are not allowed. Sleeveless shirts or dresses must have shoulder straps that are at least three inches wide. Tops must be long enough to allow for a 3 inch overlap with pants, shorts, or skirts while standing erect. No pull over sweatshirts may be worn on chapel days.

Male

Hair

Hair must be neatly combed at all times, cut no longer than collar length in the back, midway down the ear on the sides, and eyebrow length in front. Sideburns may not extend below the bottom of the ear and may be no wider than 1". Hair must be conservative in color, cut, and style. No unnatural colors are permitted. The administration will be the final judge of the appropriateness of hair length, style, or color.

Facial Hair

No facial hair of any type is allowed. Students must be clean-shaven at all times and shave daily if needed. Violation will result in a detention and demerits issued.

Jewelry

Male students may not wear body-piercing ornaments to school or any other school related activity (including sports events). No earrings of any type may be worn by male students. Other jewelry must be conservative. No chains or spikes may be worn as part of jewelry or clothing.

Hats

No hats may be worn on campus during the school day. Days during Spirit Week may be designated as "hat" days or hats may be worn when part of a theme on theme days.

Shoes

Shoes must be worn at all times.

Pants

No extremely tight fitting or **extremely baggy pants** are allowed. Appropriate size pants must be worn at all times (with shoes removed and pant legs extended, pants must not touch floor). Pants must be worn at the **natural waistline** at all times. Pants that are fashioned to appear **not at the natural waistline** are **not acceptable**. No sweat pants are allowed. All pants must be modest, without frayed cuffs or holes. No tear-away sweatpants or pajama pants are allowed.

Shirts

All dress shirts with rounded tails must be tucked in while shirts with squared or straight tails may worn out. No tank tops may be worn. T-shirts may be worn as long as they do not bear offensive symbols or writing. Dress shirts and ties must be worn on chapel day. No polo shirts on chapel day.

Sweatshirts/Sweaters

Sweatshirts that are in good taste may be worn as long as they do not bear offensive symbols or writing. Ties must be clearly visible when sweaters are worn over dress shirts on chapel day. No sweatshirts may be worn on chapel day.

Student Drivers

Conduct: Student drivers must drive carefully in the proximity of the school and in the school parking lot. Parking lot traffic patterns must be followed at all times. Extreme care must be taken in the parking lot and entering onto either TV Highway or Brookwood. Students may drive only their own cars on campus. Irresponsible driving including speeding and dangerous stopping, starting, or turns on the parking lot, 45th Avenue, Frewing, or TV Hwy. may result in the loss of driving privileges or action by local law enforcement officers. School authorities and local residents often cooperate with police to ensure the student drivers are safe.

Parking: Student drivers will be assigned a parking space either on 45th Avenue or in the parking lot. Students will be expected to use only the assigned parking space. All cars and parking lots are off-limits during school hours.

Transportation of Students

The board of Faith Bible Christian School has worked diligently to supply the best transportation for our students. Each of our buses is now receiving regular examinations and service during the school year and a thorough examination during the summer. This service for our vehicles complies with the state and federal standards set up for all school buses. The school also leases other quality school buses to supplement our own vehicles.

Faith Bible High School will arrange for all transportation to field trips, athletic activities, and other school related events. All bus drivers possess appropriate DMV and Department of Education certificates and participate in an established drug and alcohol testing program. They are experienced and will drive in a safe and prudent manner. On occasion, parent drivers and cars may be used for transportation.

At no time will students be allowed to transport other students from the school to school sponsored activities. A student may receive special written permission on a trip by trip basis to drive to such an activity. A transportation form must be obtained from the school office before the activity and returned to the office on the day before the activity. Please help us by explaining to your students the reasons for these guidelines and cooperating with our staff in any way possible.

Campus Policies

Campus Limits

Students are not allowed on the north side of our modular classrooms or on the east side of the M1/M2 building. Students are not allowed in modular classrooms without a staff member. At no time are students allowed on the roof of any of our building.

Closed Campus Policy

FBHS has a closed campus policy. Generally, the policy states that FBHS students are to remain on campus during the school day and visitors are not allowed at FBHS.

Students Leaving Campus

FBHS students may not leave campus during the school day without written permission from their parents. Students may not leave campus during the school day with other students. School day departures and classroom absences generally detract from individual student progress and cause additional work for teachers of the student. Parents must strive to minimize school day departures and use them only for vital needs such as illness, medical care or family emergencies.

Students who must leave school early should show a written note from their parents or guardian to their classroom teacher and present the note to the secretary at the office as they sign out.

Visitors

Generally FBHS does not allow visitors on campus. The following exceptions may be allowed:

1. Graduates of FBHS may visit during lunch time or chapel time.

Individuals who are interested in admission to FBHS may visit the campus during the school day if he/she:

- arranges the visit and receives approval from the school office at least 24 hours before the proposed visit
- brings a note from his/her parents stating the purpose of the visit
- abides by all rules required of FBHS students
- meets school dress code for the day including clothes, hair, jewelry, etc.

2. The staff or administration of FBHS may invite other individuals at their discretion. Special consideration may be made for visitors during school chapels.

3. Parents of current students are welcome at any time. Advanced notice is welcome if possible.

4. Parents of prospective students may visit the campus during school time when arranged through the school office.

Note: **All visitors must sign in and receive a visitor's pass at the school office before entry into school buildings. The pass must be clearly visible at all times for security reasons. This includes visitors that enter the building after school hours.**

Campus Restrictions

Some areas of the property are restricted for students. During the school day students may not be:

- on the South side of the main building
- on the North side of the modular buildings
- on the East side of the Eastern most modular building
- anywhere outside the back lot fenced area
- in the storage rooms at the West end of the dressing rooms

Gum

Gum chewing is not permitted on school property because of sanitation and cleaning problems. The no gum rule applies to all student activities, traveling to and from school activities in school provided transportation, and at all sports events, both home and away. Gum chewing will result in a detention and demerits.

Eating/Drinking

Students may bring food or drink from home or purchase them from the lunch ladies or vending machines. Students may eat and drink before school, during morning break, lunchtime, and after school only. Eating and drinking on campus is allowed in rooms 1, 2, & 3, and outside only. No eating or drinking is allowed in the gym, the modular classrooms, hallways, or any other part of the main building.

Lockers

Lockers will be provided for each student at Faith Bible High School. Students may use a combination or keyed lock if the combination or an extra key is provided for the office. For the safety of all high school students, the administration reserves the right to search lockers, bags, backpacks or any other items and their contents at any time without prior notice and hold in possession any questionable or illegal items for inquiry.

Lost & Found

Lost and found items will be kept in a container accessible to students. At the end of each quarter, items not claimed will be donated to a charitable organization.

Use of the School Building

Faith Bible High School leases the high school building from Reformation Lutheran Church. Our lease specifically states that all use must be related to school activities and purposes. Any requests for use of the gym or other facilities will be evaluated on that basis. Generally, the facilities are not open to the use of the community or other organizations.

Medications

All students must be current for immunizations and vaccinations. Oregon state law prescribes that students who do not comply with this law will be suspended. Prescription and non-prescription medicines must be administered only by the school office staff. If medication is needed at school, it must be brought to the school office by a parent with an "Administration of Prescription and Non-prescription Medication Form". Prescription medication must be in the original prescription container specifically for the student and the medication involved must be labeled with the student's name, name of medication, time to be given, proper dosage, and the physician's name. All medications, both prescription and non-prescription, must be kept in the school office.

Electronic Devices

Students may not use cell phones or pagers during school hours. They must be turned off during the school day. At no time are cell phones or pagers to be brought to class. The use of MP3 or other such recording devices, CD players, and other electronic devices are not permitted during the school day. Lap tops and hand held devices may be used for educational purposes only. Any violation of these rules may result in confiscation of the device for a period of one week.

Personal Displays of Affection

Couples/students may not have physical contact with each other while on campus, while traveling to or from school activities, in school provided transportation, at sports events (both home and away) or at any other school sponsored activities. (This includes holding hands, hugging, kissing, etc.) Couples may not be alone in unsupervised areas.

Roller Blades and Skateboards

Roller blades, skateboards, and other such equipment are prohibited on school grounds.

Attendance and Punctuality

Normal school hours are from 8:00AM to 2:45 PM, Monday through Friday.

Regular school attendance is required by law and is necessary for good scholarship. Faith Bible High School expects parents and students to cooperate with school staff in promoting good attendance and punctuality. It is assumed that students will be in classes unless there is a death in the family, an emergency, or illness. Please make every attempt to schedule doctor's or dentist's appointments after school hours.

Absences

Absences of more than 10 days in any class may result in failure and loss of credit for the class. The quality and content of a class is much greater than notes or homework can convey. Many classes may include a "participation" element used in grading. Therefore, the student's class grade may suffer from excessive absences whether excused or not. If a student is unable to attend classes, a parent must notify the school office on the day prior to the absence or between 7:45 and 9:00am the day of the absence.

Tardies

Students who are tardy to school must check in at the school office and receive an admit slip before going to class. Students will not be excused for tardies related to oversleeping, traffic, etc. To excuse a morning tardy, the school office must have a note or phone call from a parent on the day of the tardy or the day following. Students not in their seat by the beginning bell of each class period will receive a tardy. Three unexcused tardies will result in a detention and demerits. Six tardies will result in a suspension and demerits.

Students will be allowed four excused morning tardies per quarter. All additional tardies will be considered unexcused unless there is a pre-arranged appointment that is communicated to the office beforehand. Sleeping in or excessive traffic type reasons will not be excused with these additional tardies. This will ensure that we continue to have productive first period classrooms.

Students who arrive after the 8:00AM bell must check in at the office, receive an admit slip and proceed on to their classroom. If there is a good reason for the tardiness, the student must present a parent-signed written excuse to the office on the same morning or next morning for the tardiness to be excused.

Academic Program

Reports

Mid-term Report - Between the 4th and 5th weeks of each quarter the office will mail to each student's home an up-to-date grade for each class in his/her schedule.

Final Grade Report - After the last week of each quarter the office will mail to each student's home a final grade for each class in his/her schedule.

3 & 6-week Report - At the 3rd week and the 6th week all students who have earned a "D" or "F" in any class, up to that point in the quarter, will received a grade report.

Weekly Report - Any parent may request a weekly report for their child. This report contains up-to-date grade and homework progress information. The student is responsible to hand-carry the report home on Fridays and the parents are responsible for providing any motivation necessary. A weekly report will be required during the succeeding quarter of all students who earn a GPA of less than 2.00. This will be sent home with the student on Friday and must be signed by a parent and returned on Monday.

Daily Report - Any parent may request a daily report for their child. This report may contain up-to-date grade and homework progress or other information. The student is responsible to hand-carry the report home each day and the parents are responsible for

providing any motivation necessary.

Honor Roll

Students who earn between a 3.00 and 3.49 grade point average on their final quarter grades will be placed on "B" honor roll. Students who earn between 3.50 and 4.00 will be placed on "A" honor roll.

Academic Probation

Students who earn below a 2.00 grade point average on any final quarter grade will be placed on academic probation. During the following quarter, these students will be required to take home a weekly progress report each Friday. Students who fail to return the signed report on Monday will receive a 30-minute detention. Following each quarter, the FBHS staff will meet to determine the cause of the low grades and develop a plan to remedy the situation. If the student receives below a 2.00 on a succeeding quarter, the staff will again meet for the above reasons and discuss whether there is sufficient progress or cooperation to merit the student's continued enrollment at FBHS. Factors considered will be homework completion, extra help sought, student attitude, student character, and parent support. Although FBHS offers high academic standards, the staff firmly believes that all students who make a continuous effort can improve and receive credit.

Homework

The amount and difficulty of homework will vary between classes and among students. However some school guidelines will be followed:

Amount

Although the amount of homework for each class each evening will vary, the average daily amount for the average student should not exceed 30 minutes per class. It is assumed that students will make every effort to use in-class time well.

Credit for Homework

Each teacher determines what part of the total grade for a course will be based on homework. Some teachers have tests, quizzes, homework, projects, papers, and other requirements as part of student coursework. Each may be given a specific percent to be used in calculating the final class grade.

Late Homework

Since classes differ because of content and teacher style, there will be differences in the handling of the following:

- Late work due to sickness
- Amount of credit allowed for late homework
- Procedures for late homework

Students should check with the class teacher and syllabus to understand how each of

the above is handled in each class.

Unless otherwise announced, students who have been absent and need to complete make-up work will be given one day for every school day absent. Weekends count as one day for makeup.

Credit for Late Homework

Each teacher determines how much credit will be given for late homework.

Depending on how late the homework is, the student may earn full credit, part credit, or no credit. This should be communicated to the students by the teacher in class and on the class syllabus distributed to the parents at the open house and the students on their first days of class.

Cut-off Date

Because a considerable amount of time is required for teachers to correct tests and homework and to calculate final grades, each teacher may determine a late work and homework cut-off date for the quarter when no more work may be turned in. It is the student's responsibility to know this date.

Improving/Changing a Grade

Students may repeat a course in High school with the goal of improving their grade or increasing their understanding if they received a "D" or below on their first attempt at the course or if the repeat is recommended by a staff member. If the student successfully completes the course the second time, the higher of the two grades received will be entered on the permanent record.

Withdrawal/Class Change

For students to drop a course without penalty or change to another course the following restrictions must be followed:

1. All students in high school have **two weeks** at the beginning of the first semester and **one week** at the beginning of the second semester (if entering a new course), to determine if they will continue.
2. If a change is desired, a withdrawal request form must be filled out and submitted no later than the tenth day of the first semester and the fifth day of the second semester.
3. This request must be signed by the parent(s) and the teacher of both old and new courses.

School Library

The library is used for a variety of activities including student research, before and after school study, library skills instruction and yearbook. Materials selected for the library must meet collection development standards. There are no late fees for overdue materials, however a bill will be sent home for lost or damaged materials.

The library features:

- Over 3400 print resources
- Eight computers with sheltered internet access and word processing
- Database access
- Selection of young adult novels and magazines
- College and career resources
- Events throughout the year to promote free time reading including a monthly drawing and annual library week celebration

No Harassment Policy

As a high school dedicated to fostering the dignity of each person, Faith Bible High School strives to provide an environment that is free of discriminatory harassment. The search for truth and worth of each person as set forth in God's Word is integral to the purpose of Faith Bible High and presumes the right of each member of the high school community (administration, faculty, staff, coaches, students, employees, and others) to be respected as a person, without regard to sex, race, color, national origin, citizenship, handicap, or age.

All members of Faith Bible High School, especially faculty and other individuals who exercise supervisory authority, are dedicated to enforcing 'no harassment' policies, many of which are also federal and state laws. Direct harassment is person to person. Indirect harassment is the creation of a hostile environment. For the purpose of this policy, the following actions are considered to be discriminatory harassment:

1. Conduct that, by reference to the sex, race, color, religion, national origin, citizenship, handicap, age, ethnic origin and economic class of a member or members of Faith Bible High School community, intentionally or recklessly abuses, mocks or disparages, a person or persons so as to affect their educational performance or working environment at Faith Bible High School.
2. Offensive sexual behavior whenever toleration of such conduct or submission to or rejection of it is the basis for a personal or academic decision affecting an individual; or such conduct has the purpose or effect of creating an intimidating, hostile or stressful learning or working environment.

A student who believes that he/she has experienced harassment from another at Faith Bible High School is advised to discuss the incident with the administration.

Complaints and allegations of harassment will be held in confidence insofar as is possible.

Faith Bible High School regards this entire issue with seriousness, and it will take disciplinary action in matters involving harassment, ranging from verbal warning or letter of reprimand up to and including dismissal.

This policy on harassment is based upon Federal Laws, Title VII of the 1964 Civil Rights Act and Title IX of the Education Amendment of 1972.

Student Conduct

The board, staff, and administration of Faith Bible High School expect the highest standards in Christian character and attitude from each student. We are called by our Savior to live by a higher standard than those around us. The love God has shown us should be reflected in our:

- o *Respect for authority*
- o *Respect for other students*
- o *Respect for school and private property*

Our code of conduct applies to any student who is:

- o On school property;
- o At any school-sponsored activity; or
- o Whose conduct at any other time or place has an adverse effect on maintaining school order and discipline, protecting the safety and welfare of others, or damaging the reputation of our school.

Faith Bible High School has a no-tolerance policy with regard to the use and/or possession of tobacco, alcohol, and illegal drugs, possession of weapons at school, and involvement in sexual immorality. These rules apply to each student any time after enrollment and before dismissal or withdrawal. They apply to all students regardless of the time and place where the violation occurs.

Should any student become involved with any of the five items mentioned in the preceding paragraph, the principal will compile all information available and pertinent to the situation and present a summary and a recommendation to the superintendent. The student will be suspended until the superintendent makes the final determination regarding dismissal. Significant offenses other than those listed may also be grounds for dismissal.

Should a senior be dismissed during the first semester of his/her senior year, he/she will be given parting grades and will have the opportunity to enroll in another school.

If the senior is in the second semester of his/her senior year, FBHS will make a reasonable

effort to accommodate the transition to another school. Dismissed students will not be allowed to continue attending classes or participate in the Senior Commencement Ceremonies.

*Note: Inappropriate materials include but are not limited to print, audio, or video materials that contain indecent statements or pornographic or excessively violent images. The school administration will be the final authority concerning the inappropriateness of such materials.

Note: Students who arrive late to school must have a signed note from their parent by the **next school day for their tardy to be excused. Students who are late to class during the remainder of the day must have a signed note **by the following day** from a staff member or parent for their tardy to be excused. Discipline for tardies will be as follows:

- First unexcused tardy per quarter Grace
- Second Grace
- Third 30 minute detention - 5 demerits
- Fourth 60 minute detention - 5 demerits
- Fifth 90 minute detention - 5 demerits
- Sixth one day suspension - 5 demerits
- Additional possible dismissal

***Note: "Other" denotes a student offense not specifically listed in the above list. A student may receive this discipline when he/she has failed to display respect for authority, respect for other students, or respect for school or private property.

When a student earns a detention, he is issued a detention slip with a specific date assigned for the detention. A doctor's appointment or cases having to do with employment may be cause for asking permission to move the serve date. Athletics and

employment should never be cause for postponing detentions. For other than medical reasons and family emergencies, a postponed detention is always doubled and rescheduled.

We at FBHS are dedicated to the task of helping students grow in their relationship with the Lord. However, at times, some students may have difficulty respecting the standards we have set. When students violate some of the above listed rules, a warning, detention, suspension, or dismissal may result. In addition to the specific discipline, the preceding chart displays the number of demerits that will be added to the student's record. Demerit totals will be calculated at the middle and end of each reporting period. Students who earn dangerously high numbers of demerits will receive a warning letter and/or a call from the principal.

Students who earn 100 demerits at anytime in the school year, the student will be dismissed for the remainder of the year. Dismissed students may apply for re-admission for the next school year.

Should any student be dismissed from Faith Bible High School, he/she may appeal this decision to the board in writing and appear before the board at the next regularly scheduled meeting. If the dismissal is upheld, the student will have the opportunity to request re-enrollment for the next school year. The superintendent will consider the request and will solicit recommendations from the school staff as part of the process.

Hazing

The administration and teaching staff of Faith Bible High School will not tolerate hazing of any kind. Hazing is defined as any attempt to interfere with the personal rights of an individual with regards to their person, their possessions, or their well-being. Hazing can involve individuals or groups and is usually the action of those with more status or power on those with less status or power. The consequences of hazing may range from a personal conference with the principal to a dismissal from school depending on the situation.

Due Process

When accused of a behavior violation, students are entitled to the following elements of "due process". The right to:

- be informed of the rules and regulations involved
- be informed of the allegations
- request a hearing
- request a copy of all information and rulings regarding the incident

Internet and Network Working Policy

The internet will provide our students and staff with access to the world through links with media, colleges and universities, and other sites throughout the world. Because of its enormous size, the internet's potential is boundless. However, with the great potential for education also comes some potential for abuse. Because access to the internet provides connections to other computer systems located all over the world, users must understand that neither Faith Bible High School nor any staff member controls the content of the information available on these other systems. Through a sheltered provider in its power to limit the availability of controversial and offensive materials through our systems. We do not condone the use of such material by any student or staff member. The purpose of this statement is to serve as a reminder of the proper and acceptable use of our computer systems, networks, and internet access.

FBHS will do all

The use of the FBHS computer network and internet access is a privilege and not a right. Inappropriate use will result in restriction or cancellation of access privileges. Behaviors that can result in suspension/revocation of access privileges include but are not limited to:

- involvement in any activity prohibited by law
- using profanity, vulgarities, obscenities, or other language which is offensive

- o to or degrades others
- o using the network for financial gain or political lobbying except as expressly allowed during a school activity
- o intentional use of invasive software such as “viruses”, “worms”, and other detrimental activities
- o attempts to log on as a system administrator or another user
- o viewing, storing, transferring, or transmitting obscene, sexually explicit, or pornographic materials
- o using or transmitting any type of chain letters, hate mail, threatening messages, harassment, or racial, sexist, or discriminatory remarks
- o sharing your own or another’s password or using another’s password
- o transferring, utilizing, or storing materials in violation of copyright laws or license agreements
- o trespassing in another’s folders, work, or files
- o intentionally altering the contents, organization, or structure of any school computer
- o intentionally entering into any folder in the control panel
- o downloading music or video games
- o playing video games

All users of the FBHS network and internet will be held fully responsible for the use of their account to transfer or store materials. Any inappropriate activities carried out will be considered to be the actions of the account holder. Therefore, passwords must not be shared or transferred.

Students may not reveal their personal name, home address, home phone number, or phone numbers of other individuals. Students must notify a parent/guardian and a teacher immediately if any individual is trying to contact them for illicit or suspicious activities. Students may not use chat rooms while on school computers.

Athletics

The primary goal of athletics at Faith is character development. Winning is defined not by the scoreboard but by whether or not character building has taken place and whether or not God has been honored in the contest.

Under the direction of godly men and women FBHS offers the following sports: Soccer, Volleyball, Basketball & Softball.

ELIGIBILITY

In order to participate in FBHS athletics, participants must:

- o Have passing grades in all subjects on the previous quarter’s final grades.
- o Have not lower than a 2.00 GPA on the previous quarter’s final grades (Fall sport eligibility will be determined by the final quarter of the previous year).
- o Maintain these standards for each 3-week reporting period during the season (This includes the 3-week report, 6-week report, and 9-week final report in each class).

The athletic director will acquire student records for the previous quarter and determine the eligibility for each participant. He will notify the student of the status of his eligibility for participation.

The athletic director will supply teachers with a form listing participating athletes at each 3-week reporting period. The teachers will determine a grade based on the student’s record up to that point in the quarter. They will record grades on the form and return it to the athletic director. He will then determine the status for continuing eligibility and communicate this to the individual athlete.

Any athlete who does not meet the standards on a report will forfeit the ability to play in games and travel to away games during the succeeding three week period. If he/she does not meet the standards by the next report, he/she will be dropped from the team.

SCHOOL ATTENDANCE

Athletes must attend all classes on the day of a contest in order to participate. In special circumstances, exceptions may be made by the athletic director.

BEHAVIOR

The athlete is responsible to conduct him/herself in a manner that will bring honor to the Lord, the school, his/her family, and him/herself. Un-sportsmanlike conduct in any form will be grounds for immediate removal from the game or team and possible suspension or dismissal from school.

Student Activities and Positions

Teacher or Office Aide

Description: Each year some students are asked to help as office or teacher aides. A student in this position will be under the supervision of the secretary or a classroom teacher. Students selected as aides will be scheduled into a set period of the day. Grading will be on a pass/fail basis and satisfactory completion of both semesters will earn one credit.

Eligibility and/or Requirements:

- The student must be requested by the secretary or a classroom teacher.
- The student must have a 3.00 or better accumulative GPA as of the last completed semester.
- The student may serve as an aide only once in his/her high school years.

Ministry Coordinator

Description: Each year the principal will ask one or several student to serve as ministry Coordinator(s) for the student body. This student(s) will be responsible for researching ministry opportunities and scheduling activities that allow students to serve in our school and community.

Eligibility and/or Requirements:

- The student must be a junior or senior.

Student Ministry Team

Description: Students who are led to take an active part in ministry are encouraged to join the Student Ministry Team. These students will be asked to help lead others in the various activities scheduled by the Ministry Coordinator. Participation in certain ministry opportunities may be limited to this worship team.

Eligibility and/or Requirements:

- Any student who is led to minister to others is welcome to join.

Chi Alpha

Description: Chi Alpha (Christ First) – Students join together for devotion and prayer every Thursday morning at 7:15am. This is an informal time where students can share insights from the Scriptures and share praises and needs for prayer.

Eligibility and/or Requirements:

- All students are welcome to attend.

Student Council

Description: Student council members generally meet once per week to plan and organize student activities and discuss student issues. Their goal is to promote spiritual growth and school spirit among the students and provide positive social events.

Eligibility and/or Requirements:

- All full-time students are eligible to apply.
- Applicants must have no more than 50 demerits by the end of third quarter of the year in which they apply.
- Applicants must have a 2.75 or better accumulative GPA as of the last completed semester.
- Three Student Council members are elected from each grade level.
- Students must maintain a 2.75 GPA during the year.
- Incoming 9th grade students must meet the above qualifications with the accumulative GPA from the entire 8th grade year considered.

Worship Team

Description: Each year praise and worship for our Monday morning opening and our Wednesday chapel is planned and led by our Student Worship Team. Team members are expected to attend some summer planning and practice sessions and early morning (7:00AM) rehearsals on Mondays and Wednesdays during the school year.

Eligibility and/or Requirements:

- Students must apply during the third quarter of one year to serve the following year.
- All full-time students are eligible to apply.
- Students must have a 2.5 or better accumulative GPA as of the last completed semester and no more than 30 demerits at the time of application.

Fall High School Retreat

Description: Each year Faith Bible High School students are invited to attend a 2-day, 1-night retreat at Winema Christian Camp located about 16 miles north of Lincoln City on the Oregon Coast. This retreat is designed to help students get to know one another and create unity within the body. This Retreat is schedule in mid September.

Eligibility and/or Requirements:

- All students are encouraged to attend.
- The school does not require student attendance.
- Students must provide a parent-signed permission slip and supply the fee required (TBA).

Leadership Conference

Description: This conference is designed to inspire and equip students to serve in leadership roles. The 3-day, 2-night event is either sponsored by ACSI or by FBHS.

Eligibility and/or Requirements:

- The student must be a member of Student Council or Worship Team, or a leader of Ministry Team or Chi Alpha
- The student must provide a parent-signed permission slip and supply the fee required (usually about \$95).

Athletic Teams

Description: Students are invited to try out for any of our after school sports. Our goal for athletics at FBHS is to provide a positive experience in team play while promoting improvement of skills and development of Christian character.

Eligibility and/or Requirements:

- Students must pay a fee specific to each sport and furnish a parent-signed permission slip and accompanying forms.
- Students must have a previous quarter GPA of 2.00 or better and no failing grades to begin the season.
- Students must maintain this standard at each three-week period report during the season.

Sports Trips

Description: About half of the games played in each sport involves travel to another school. Away game trips often include dinner out at a fast-food place along the way. Student spectators who wish to travel on school provided transportation must meet the following requirements.

Eligibility and/or Requirements:

- Student spectator involvement may be limited by the space on the school provided transportation.
- Student spectators must have parent-signed permission slips in order to travel with teams.
- Student spectators may participate as long as they are missing not more than half of their last period class.

High Five Team

Description: Each year FBHS participates in the High Five Academic Challenge. Each week of the school year, two teams from Oregon and Washington high schools compete in an academic match that is taped and aired on a local TV station. In the past five years of participation, FBHS has proved to be very competitive and successful in this event. The team consists of 7 FBHS students.

Eligibility and/or Requirements:

- All full-time students are eligible to try out for the team.
- Members will be chosen on the basis of scores from a series of knowledge quizzes given to each student who applies.

Drama Performances

Description: Depending on student interest and school resources, FBHS presents Winter and Spring drama performances. In the past, these plays have been excellent and well attended. The Winter performance is smaller in scale while the Spring presentation is usually an elaborate and highly successful event. Both performances depend on after school practices and are usually self-supporting.

Eligibility and/or Requirements:

- Students must furnish a parent-signed permission slip.
- Students must have a previous quarter GPA of 2.00 or better and no failing grades to begin the production.
- Students must maintain this standard at each three-week period report during the production.

Winter Concert

Description: This evening scheduled in early December features the choir, ensemble, individual and small groups and sign language students. The students perform music they have practiced since the beginning of the year.

Eligibility and/or Requirements:

- All Choir, Ensemble, and Sign Language students may participate.
- All students, parents, and guests are welcome.

Winter Banquet

Description: During the winter of each year the student council plans a formal banquet at one of the nearby hotels or banquet rooms. Dress is formal with a seated or buffet dinner and entertainment planned. Although it is acceptable to come as couples, individuals and groups are common. All students are expected to dress in good taste and modesty for the event.

Eligibility and/or Requirements:

- All FBHS students and their guests are welcome.
- Students and their guests need tickets sold by the Student Council.

Spirit Week

Description: Each year, toward the end of February and the Winter sports season, one week is designated as Spirit Week. The first four days of the week are labeled as special dress (such as “Twin Day” or “Time Travel Day”) and Friday is usually “School Colors Day” with a “Spirit Assembly” is often scheduled at the end of the day.

Eligibility and/or Requirements:

- All students are encouraged to participate.
- Students who do not participate in the dress of the day must be in regular dress code for that day.

Outdoor School Counseling

Description: Each year the sixth grade students from our other campus attend “Outdoor School” at a designated camp facility. Their teachers prefer that our upper grade high school students serve as counselors for these students. Some of our older students volunteer for this ministry. The counselors are needed for 5 weekdays and will miss a considerable amount of class time.

Eligibility and/or Requirements:

- Students must have a 3.00 or better accumulative GPA as of their last completed semester.
- Students must be passing all current quarter classes.
- Students must have no more than 50 demerits at the time of application.
- Students must have the approval of all seven of their classroom teachers.
- Students must make up school work missed during the week.

ACSI Musicale

Description: Choir and Ensemble class students may participate in the ACSI Musicale usually scheduled during three days in early March. Students from Washington and Oregon high schools gather to compete in various vocal events.

Students travel to a college campus for the competition and stay in a local motel.

Eligibility and/or Requirements:

- Students in Choir and Ensemble are expected to attend.
- Students must provide a student fee and motel costs and a parent-signed permission slip. Fundraisers often offset some of the cost of the trip.

Field Trips

Description: Classroom teachers often plan and sponsor field trips related to the content covered in their courses. The school provides transportation by bus, light rail or parent drivers.

Eligibility and/or Requirements:

- Students who have a “D” or “F” grade or a significant amount of missing work may not be allowed to participate.
- Students must supply any individual costs (meals, entrance fees, etc.) and a parent-signed permission slip.

Washington DC Trip

Description: Every three years a Washington DC trip is scheduled. Students who participate will visit places like The White House, The Pentagon, and The Smithsonian Museums in DC, as well as Arlington, Gettysburg, the Amish Country, and often New York. The next trip is scheduled for seven days in April of 2009.

Eligibility and/or Requirements:

- All FBHS students are eligible to attend.
- Students must have parent-signed permission slips and provide the individual cost (usually about \$1700).
- Students are required to make up all missed school work.

Spring Concert

Description: This evening scheduled in early Spring features the choir, ensemble, individual and small groups and sign language students. The students perform music they’ve practiced since December.

Eligibility and/or Requirements:

- Choir, Ensemble, and Sign Language Students Participate.
- All students, parents, and guests are welcome.

Revival Week

Description: Each year during the middle of December and May, Revival Weeks are scheduled. During these weeks Chapels are scheduled daily and speaker(s) from local churches come and challenge our students to grow spiritually.

Eligibility and/or Requirements:

- All students attend Revival Week meetings and are invited to share and take part in the services.

Spring High School Retreat

Description: Each year Faith Bible High School students are invited to attend a 2-day, 1-night retreat at Winema Christian Camp located about 16 miles north of Lincoln City on the Oregon Coast. This retreat is designed to honor our senior class and finish the year with spiritual emphasis. This Retreat is schedule in mid May.

Eligibility and/or Requirements:

- All students are encouraged to attend.
- The school does not require student attendance.
- Students must provide a parent-signed permission slip and supply the fee required (usually about \$50).

Senior Dinner

Description: On the last Monday for seniors, Seniors, their parents, and other relatives are invited to come and honor our graduates. Parents are invited to share memories of their kids and bring a few pictures to share. This dinner is a pot-luck with the school providing drinks, and place settings.

Eligibility and/or Requirements:

- All full-time Seniors and their parents and guests are welcome to attend.

Senior Wills

Descriptions: This assembly, held during the last week before Senior Commencement, allows Seniors to “will” their classmates lockers, flowers, characteristics,

etc. This tradition has been popular with our departing Seniors as it is the last time they have to communicate directly with their fellow students and teachers.

Eligibility and/or Requirements:

- All full-time seniors are welcome to participate in Senior Wills.
- Parents are welcome to attend.

Senior Graduation

Description: Each year FBHS honors our Senior Class with a commencement ceremony held at a local church or other facility. The event includes praise and worship, special music, salutorian and valedictorian messages, and sharing by Seniors.

Eligibility and/or Requirements:

- All full-time Seniors who meet FBHS graduation requirements are invited to participate.
- All parents, relatives, and friends are welcome.

Faith Bible High School Honors

National Honor Society

Description: The purpose of the Falcon Chapter of National Honor Society is to honor those students who have shown excellence in academics, service, and character.

Members seek to serve their fellow students by participating in various service projects.

- Members must be full-time Junior or Senior High students.
- Members must show evidence of positive character.
- Members must show evidence of leadership in their church, school, or community.
- Members must show evidence of past participation in service to their church, school, or community.

Valedictorian and Salutatorian Honors

Each year the administration of Faith Bible High School selects students from the senior class for Valedictorian and Salutatorian honors. Traditionally, the Valedictorian and Salutatorian honors go to the students who have the highest and second highest grade point averages respectively. Because some students may have like grade point averages, it is possible and common for more than one student to receive each honor.

Students receiving these honors may be asked to give a short address during the senior commencement for their class. Candidates for Valedictorian and Salutatorian must meet the following requirements:

- Must be a full-time student at FBHS for at least 2 full years.
- Must receive credit for at least 2 advanced placement courses.
- Valedictorian must have highest GPA of eligible students.
- Salutatorian must have second highest GPA of eligible students.

Note: GPA is calculated as the average of the first seven semester GPA's of the student's high school years.

School Affiliations

Faith Bible High School is affiliated with a number of associations in order to equip our staff with training and new ideas that will enrich the educational process. These organizations also provide opportunities and activities for our students to help to broaden and strengthen their education.

The Northwest Association of Accredited Schools (NAAS)

The Northwest Association of Accredited Schools provides the most prestigious accreditation available in the states of Oregon, Washington, Idaho, Montana, Nevada, Utah, and Alaska. This will be Faith Bible's sixth year of accreditation with NAAS.

The Oregon Student Activities Association (OSAA)

The purpose of the Oregon Student Activities Association is to approve, promote, develop and direct activities among its member schools that will contribute to a well-rounded and meaningful educational experience at the secondary level. Faith Bible has been a member of OSAA for 4 years.

The Association of Christian Schools International (ACSI)

The Association of Christian Schools International is a service organization serving Christian schools across the United States and around the world. ACSI provides training, guidance, resource materials, and opportunities to enrich the educational process. Faith Bible is a member of ACSI.
